## CT LOTTERY HISTORY TIME LINE

June 1971: To generate revenue for the state, Governor Thomas J. Meskill signs Public Act No. 865 to create the Connecticut State Lottery. In September, a bi-partisan team of commissioners is selected.


February 15, 1972: The Connecticut State Lottery begins ticket sales at 3,000 retailer locations state wide, offering one game called "The Lottery." Tickets cost $50 \$$ each. Drawings held weekly with a top prize of $\$ 5,000$. Connecticut's lottery is the fourth in the nation


September 9, 1975: "Instant Match," the first scratch game in CT goes on sale. Top Prize: \$10,000. Proceeds temporarily earmarked by the legislature to support education services in the state.


September 1976: The Lottery appears on television with "Double Play," its first weekly TV game show. Top prize is $\$ 200,000$. This becomes the highest rated television show originated in Connecticut at that time.

March 16, 1977: "The Daily Numbers" game begins. Match three digits, or variations on the combination, to win up to \$2,500 per ticket. Drawings held daily.


July 1978: "The Money Tree" TV game show launches, following the departure of "Double Play."

October 1980: "Play 4" begins. Match four digits, or variations on the combination, and win up to $\$ 25,000$ per ticket. Drawings held once a week at the start.

October 7, 2000: CT Lottery is back on TV with the premiere of "Powerball - The Game Show." The top prize is $\$ 1,000,000$.

June 13, 2003: Lt. Governor M. Jodi Rell hailed the broadening of Connecticut's AMBER Alert system through a newly formed partnership between the Connecticut Lottery Corporation and local and state

## 2022

July 2022: The CT Lottery capped its 50th year by returning \$406 million (unaudited) in profits to the State in the 2022 fiscal year (July 2021 - June 2022), second only to last fiscal year's record profits. Lottery sales also totaled a second-best ever $\$ 1.45$ billion, which included $\$ 839$ million in instant game sales.

August 15, 2022: The CT Lottery and Credit Unions Building Financial Independence teamed up on a new financial literacy and education campaign, "Wise Winnings." This joint effort is the first-of-its-kind in the country and offers no-cost financial advice to CT Lottery cash prize-winners, along with helpful tips on making a plan for a sudden windfall.
